With matching gifts from an anonymous donor, the Redevelopment Commission and the City, your donations will multiply over and over. All money in this fund will be used by the Park Department to plant trees in parks and city-owned properties, keeping Valparaiso green and growing for generations to come.

- When you donate \$1 per month, sponsors donate \$7 per month = 1 tree per year
